POST-WILDFIRE EFFECTS ON BLM'S KASHE-KATUWE TENT ROCKS (KKTR) NATIONAL MONUMENT

This research for NM AMP is a collaborative project with the Bureau of Land Management. The study site is Peralta Canyon in Tents Rock National Canyon, which has been majorly impacted by wildfire and ensuing floods. The overall objectives with this research are to investigate existing, short-term and possible long-term effects on Peralta Creek and its floodplain post-fire and post-flood conditions; and to examine the area's potential for riparian ecology. This research will be used to make recommendations to BLM for the management of Peralta Canyon.
