STATISTICS ON TRIAL: CRITICAL THINKING IN ACTION

The understanding of statistics and probability is important in many disciplines and in everyday life. Statistics is being used more and more in the courtroom. Trial lawyers often use statistics as a way of convincing a jury of a person's guilt or innocence. As a juror, would you understand enough about statistics to evaluate an expert's testimony? Participants will get to hear some evidence about a shocking case and then participate in deliberations. This type of activity is a great way for students to learn to think critically and to apply some concepts from both statistics and criminal justice in a real-life situation. Presenters will discuss ways to use and assess critical thinking in any discipline.
