Refreshments will be provided, sponsored by the Engineering Student Services' NSF Scholarship Program

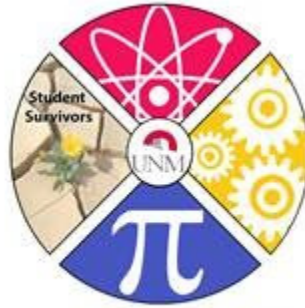


Inspiring Women in in STEM Panel Discussion at UNM - LA
