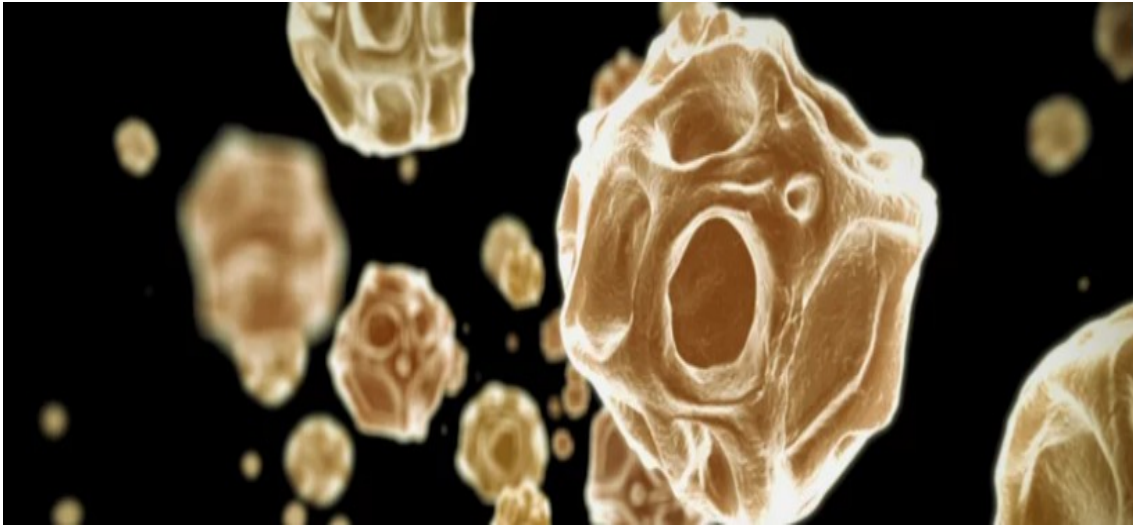

What do you know about slime mold? It is not a plant or an animal. It has no brain yet it is able to make intelligent decisions. Slime mold is a simple organism that consists of an acellular mass of creeping colorful jelly, a real life science fiction.

The Creeping Garden by Tim Graham and Jasper Sharp 2014 is a British documentary where scientists and artists discuss and grapple with their interest in slime mold. We will be screening the Creeping Garden at the Guild Cinema on October 20th at 4pm, 6pm, and 8pm.
