
UNM's Veteran Sound-Off Day on Sept 21st!

What do you know about slime mold? It is not a plant or an animal. It has no brain yet it is able to make intelligent decisions. Slime mold is a simple organism that consists of an acellular mass of creeping colorful jelly, a real life science fiction.

The Creeping Garden by Tim Graham and Jasper Sharp 2014 is a British documentary where scientists and artists discuss and grapple with their interest in slime mold. We will be screening the Creeping Garden at the Guild Cinema on October 20th at 4pm, 6pm, and 8pm. Student-Led Central Corridor Neighborhood Study

Join a student-led, community-oriented group research project with the School of Architecture + Planning!

The <u>School of Architecture + Planning</u> is seeking student volunteers who are interested in gaining practical experience doing field research under the guidance of graduate student leaders, faculty members, and in response to community members, non-profits, and local businesses. To gather a diverse range of information, small teams will study 5 neighborhoods on Central Corridor. Research goals include identifying neighborhoods at high risk for displacement due to transit-oriented development, and identifying ways to mitigate these risks and maximize potential benefits for communities. Activities will include mapping unused property, auditing the 'walkability' of a neighborhood, interviewing residents, cataloguing local organizations, and more.
