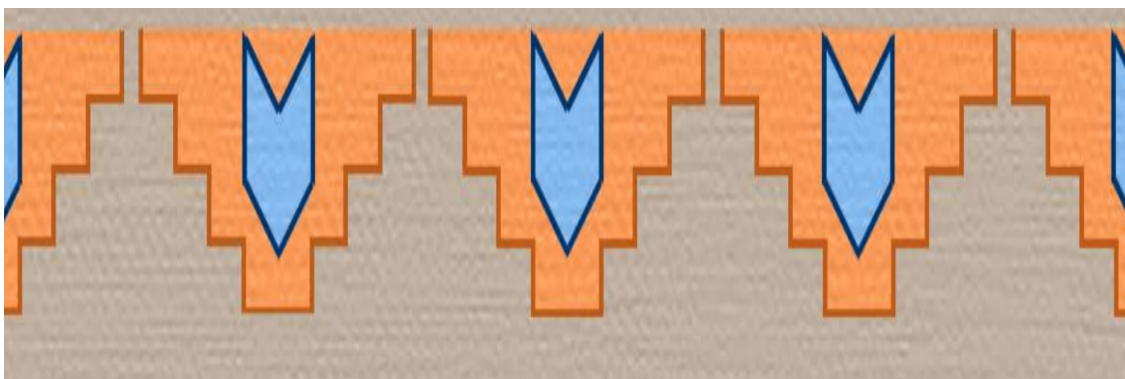


Free Physics Demo Night! Astonishing Feats of Physics!
