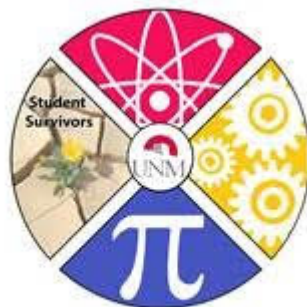
## What are you doing for your STEM career in the spring? Save a spot today with the STEM Collaborative's new events!
