Students in the program are matched with an AFRL mentor and the two of them collaborate on various informal activities throughout the semester to enhance their educational and career experiences.

According to Tom Turner, associate dean for research in the College of Arts & Sciences, the effort serves more than just a single purpose: "The funding really helps students engage in research activities directly or it allows students to go to meetings where they can disseminate the results of their research to professionals in their field, which allows for networking and those kinds of opportunities."
